

Extract from the proceedings of the
Council of Education dated 10th June 1846

No. VIII. Read Letter from the Secretary Hindu
 College No. 204 dated 9th May, repre-
 senting that it would be most bene-
 ficial to the interests of the College
 to have a Special Mathematical
 Teacher attached to the Institution,
 who would be willing on proper
 remuneration to devote the whole
 of his time and attention to the duties,
 that the additional expense which
 this arrangement will involve, may
 be defrayed out of the undivided
 portion of the Fund assigned to this
 Institution, and that if the measure
 is sanctioned, the refusal of the
 appointment be given to the pre-
 sent Professor of Mathematics.
 Ordered to be strongly recommended
 to Government as absolutely necessary
 for

for providing efficient mathematical instruction for the Hindu College: that the rate of salary be the same as that granted to Professors in the Haughly College: and that Mr. Rice have the first offer of the Professorship upon the new terms - viz that the whole of his time be devoted to the Hindu College.

Read Letter from the same No. 205 dated N^o. IX 23rd May forwarding a Letter from the Principal dated 18th Instant, recommending the most eligible arrangement for carrying on the duties of the Head Master of the Junior Department and Visitor School Society's School, and stating that the Committee approve of the arrangements excepting that part which suggests to appropriate the 50 ^{Rs} hitherto paid to the Visitor to the increase of the inadequate salary of the Head Master of the School.

Ordered that the recommendations of the

Management be confirmed.
