On receipt of your letter I made some enquiries about the comparative merits of the publications of Drs. Nalini Kanto Brahmo and Mahendra Nath Sarkar of a recognised authority on the subject, on whose opinion the greatest reliance can be placed. In his opinion, though Dr. Sarkar has written more books than Dr. Brahmo, yet the Philosophy of Hindu Sadhana written by the -- latter (Dr. Brahmo) shows more definite thinking and precise schol arship than Dr. Sarkar's works. I do not wish to commit the name of the gentleman on paper, but would be prepared to give it to you over the phone.

As Dr. Brahmo has moreover been acting as the head of the department and is an able and pains-taking officer, I would, therefore, recommend that he might be appointed temporarily to the Grade 1 of the Bengal Educational Service pending the permanent appointment.
