My dear Sen,

Regarding your D.O. No.119, dated 29th July, 1938, concerning Babu Gurupada Ghatak, Drill Master, Hindu School. I cannot stand in his way as regards increments, because, within the limits of his knowledge he is quite good, and in the annual Physical Training competition his boys always put up a good show.

I think, however, that you should take up the question of Gurupada's transfer to the general teaching line. He is now 39 years of age, inclined to be a bit stout, and therefore not likely to keep up his standard of work. Educationally he is a non-matric. and he could not, therefore, be transferred as a Vernacular teacher on his present salary scale unless he were first deputed to a Normal School for training. I believe, however, the Director of Public Instruction would be willing to make this arrangement if you were to press for it. Such training and ultimate transfer are in accordance with the policy agreed to by Govt. some years ago, under which all physical training teachers are to be drafted to the general teaching line as they advance in age.

It is now time for such an important school as the Hindu School to have a fully trained graduate instructor. I can easily find a first-class man who will be willing to we work on the Rs.50/- grade pending conversion of the salary scale by Govt., and I am sure such a man will be able to solve the problems of small space etc. and introduce up-to-date methods much more effectively than Gurupada Babu has been able to do.

If you agree to this, will you please let me have a letter on the subject, and I shall at once approach the Director of Public Instruction.
