Sir,

I have the honour to invite a reference to this office cincular letter Nos.802-850C, dated the 8th November 1932, in which attention was invited to the various memoranda issued by this office regarding the pamphlets published by the Bengal Publicity Board, and the duties of the members of the staff of colleges and high schools (Government and Aided) in respect of these pamphlets were clearly laid down. These publications are now being supplied to educational institutions by the Publicity Board, and not by this office.

2. It has been suggested that in a great many cases the pamphlets have never been used.

I am aware that not all of the publications are entirely suitable for use in educational institutions, but many of them contain an excellent and telling stock of information, and Government are anxious that they should be utilised to the best possible advantage.
