Sir,

I beg most respectfully to state that my crossing of the second efficiency bar will fall due to the 8th of July, 1939. I pray that you will kindly move Government to permit me to cross the second efficiency bar and draw salary at the rate of Rs.700/- (Seven hundred only) per month with effect from the 8th of July, 1939. I enclose in the sheets annexed an account of my qualifications and work in the College.

I may also be permitted to state, in this connection, that I was permitted to cross the first efficiency bar at the stage of Rs.650/- in the Bengal Senior Educational Service and draw salary at the rate of Rs.700/- per month from the 29th of January, 1938, to the 3rd of July, 1938, while acting as Senior Professor of Economics in the Islamia College, Calcutta (copy of Government order is annexed).

Sir,

In continuation of this Department endorsement No. 3851-Edn., dated the 8th December, 1937, I am directed to state that Babu - Durgagati Chatteraj of the Bengal Educational Service who has been appointed to act in the Bengal Senior Educational Service as Professor of Economics, Islamia College, Calcutta should be regarded as having crossed the efficiency bar at Rs. 650/- in the time scale of Bengal Senior Educational Service and should be allowed to draw, under Fundamental Rule 31, read with Fundamental Rule 22, pay at Rs. 700/- (Rupees seven hundred) per mensem, being the stage in the Bengal Senior Educational Service next above his substantive pay, as the officiating appointment involves the assumption of duties and responsibilities of greater importance.
