Secondly, I have received complaints from more than one member of the staff of a certain amount of defiance in the attitude of the present batch of students of the Sanskrit College. While there is no overt act of indiscipline, such an attitude has an indirect influence on the morale of the College which may lead to troubles afterwards. I wish, therefore, to draw your pointed attention to my proposals for the termination of the present arrangements.
