

With reference to your No. 1407 A (Confidential) dated the 1st March 1933 regarding the proposed transfer of Maulvi Kazi Abdul Wadud as Lecturer in Bengali, Presidency College, I have the honour to state that I cannot think of the Maulvi in that capacity. If his life at Dacca is unhappy, his position here would be impossible in the absence of ^{any} ~~his~~ academic qualifications in the subject he teaches. It is moreover certain that the University will raise a strong objection to the arrangement. If any private college had suggested such an appointment, I, as a Syndic, would have recorded my strong disapproval and I am sure that the Director of Public Instruction and other Syndics would have agreed with me.
