The old form of return regarding Candidates for Junior Scholarships was inadvertently sent from this office in the place of the new form as modified by the Junior Scholarship rules of the 22nd February 1865. The sixth clause of the old rules imposed a limit of age which has been cancelled, as it was found to exclude those men only above 19 years of age who spoke the truth. The new rules admit to Scholarship students of any age provided they have studied for the last twelve months at the school to which they belong at the time of presenting themselves at the Entrance Examination. If any student who has changed his school within this period wishes to compete for Junior Scholarships, he must first obtain the sanction in writing of the Director of Public Instruction.
